UG's Faculty Of Social Sciences Honours Students For Outstanding Performances; Chief Justice Urges Graduates To Maintain Professionalism And To Be Of Service

The University of Guyana's Faculty of Social Sciences (FSS), for the first time in the institution's 58-year history, hosted a special Award and Prize Giving Ceremony to recognise and honour the outstanding performances of its graduates of the Class 2020/2021.

604 students from the FSS, participated in the virtual march of graduates when the university hosted a series of graduation ceremonies in February which saw a total of 2600 persons graduating.

The Award and Prize Giving Ceremony for graduating and continuing students was held on Tuesday, February 22, 2022, at the George Walcott Lecture Theatre, Turkeyen Campus and catered for the award recipients and special invitees only due to strict Covid-19 health protocols being in place.

Guyana's Chief Justice (ag), Hon. Madame Roxane George S.C delivered the feature address. Justice George congratulated the awardees for their exemplar performances and wished them well as they embark on their careers. The CJ urged the graduates to always respect the human rights of persons, maintain a high level of professionalism and be of service to their fellow human beings. "You have a responsibility to provide the leadership that is necessary to ensure that you show respect for all...I urge you to focus on advancing human rights by bold leadership so as to leave a rich legacy of accomplishment, by applying the skills not only to earn a livelihood but in voluntary service," the CJ urged.

"In order to provide such bold leadership, you must ensure that professionalism is the foundation of all you do. Professionalism requires adhering to sound principles and values as prescribed by and for your particular profession...Professionals see it as their duty to apply their knowledge, learning and skills so as to benefit their organisations,

communities, and ultimately the society as a whole...Professionals must aid to serve and not necessarily to be served," she added.

Justice George noted that with the advent of the oil and gas industry, Guyana will finally achieve the potential that has been touted for many years. "Guyana needs each and every one of you to ensure that what is achieved does not become a reality just for some while remaining in the realm of potential for others," the CJ told the awardees.

University of Guyana's Vice-Chancellor, XI, Prof. Paloma Mohamed Martin in giving brief remarks at the event made two profound statements - 1. The number one infrastructure of any country is education, and 2. Poverty is the biggest contributor to climate change and environmental degradation. "This tells us that at the center of everything that we do, all disciplines, all of human endeavours, is the human being, and that's who you take care of. You are all social scientists and everything that you do matters to human beings and to our country," the VC expressed.

"Most importantly you are the ones who will fundamentally affect people's outcomes in life, you affect not only how they feel about each other and what they do. You are
