UG Hosts Talk on Energy Contract Negotiations with Top Global Expert Professor Norman Nadorff

The University of Guyana's Institute for Energy Diplomacy (IED), in collaboration with the Association of International Energy Negotiators (AIEN) on Wednesday, April 10, 2024, hosted a talk titled "Energy Contract Negotiations: Achieving Better Results in Less Time." This event which was held at the university's George Walcott Lecture Theatre (GWLT), Turkeyen Campus, saw a high-level presentation from Special Counsel for Mayer Brown Law Firm and Professor at the University of Houston, Norman Nadorff.

Professor Nadorff's presentation dissected impediments to contract negotiation, emphasising several crucial points in the contract negotiation process. He encouraged attendees to pay attention to how contracts are written, stating that they should be written to "express and not impress".

Addressing a diverse audience comprising legal professionals, UG law students, faculty members, and industry experts, Professor Nadorff elaborated on key strategies for effective negotiation. These strategies encompassed cultural sensitivities, comprehension of pre-contractual documentation, strategic preparation, contextual negotiation, and prioritising contractual terms over interpersonal dynamics among others.

In her remarks, Vice-Chancellor Professor Paloma Mohamed Martin noted that the session is critical as it will boost the capacity of the agencies involved in the area of energy contract negotiations. The VC further elucidated the rationale behind establishing UG's Institute of Energy Diplomacy noting the critical work it is doing in helping to build out the necessary academic

programmes and shape national policies in the oil and gas sector. She underlined the importance of creating specialised degrees, sharing that while UG has a Law programme it did not previously have the energy or negotiation specialisation. Professor Mohamed Martin added that the University of Guyana played a pivotal role in the external consultations for the second local content framework.

Director of UG's IED, Dr Norwell Hinds, echoed Professor Mohamed Martin's sentiments, emphasising IED's mandate to collaborate with stakeholders in driving the energy agenda forward through research and advocacy initiatives among others.

The event concluded with a stimulating question and answer segment with attendees engaging Professor Nadorff on various facets of contract negotiation.

Professor Norman Nadorff, Special Counsel at Mayer Brown Law Firm, has over three decades of experience as in-house counsel for leading oil companies, with a focus on Latin America, West Africa, and Indonesia. As an Adjunct Professor of Law at the University of Houston Law Centre since 2012, he has imparted his expertise in International Petroleum Agreements to students globally.

The University of Guyana continues to engage experts in various fields to ensure Guyanese are well-informed in matters concerning national and regional development.
