The persistent migration and movement of communities of Guyanese and Caribbean Peoples to and from their perceived homelands, to other areas of the Caribbean, South and North America, Europe, and other areas of the world have become a defining feature of the late 20th and early 21st centuries. According to Forbes Magazine, Guyana, which today has one of the fastest growing economies in the world, remains at the top of the chart, as the country with the highest global migration rate. Guyana has produced distinct "diasporas" in major capitals. There are 'little Guyanas', some officially named as in New York City, and others that crept up and are noticed in Washington D.C, London, Suriname, Barbados, French Guiana, and Venezuela to name a few. Communities of Guyanese and Caribbean peoples such as in Brooklyn, Toronto, Brixton, and many other places are commonly referred to as the Guyanese and Caribbean Diasporas. In these and other places the home culture survives and thrives away from home.
